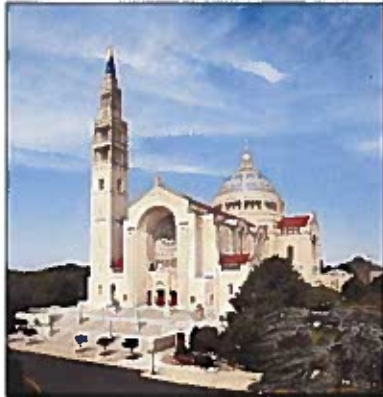

THE BASILICA OF THE NATIONAL SHRINE OF THE IMMACULATE CONCEPTION



Affectionately referred to as America's Catholic Church, the Basilica of the National Shrine of the Immaculate Conception in Washington, DC, has been a century in the making since the laying of its foundation stone in 1920.

Designated by the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops as a National Sanctuary of Prayer and Pilgrimage, the Basilica is our nation's preeminent Marian Shrine, dedicated to the Patroness of the United States, the Blessed Virgin Mary under her title of the Immaculate Conception. Mary's Shrine, as it is often called, is the largest Roman Catholic Church in North America and is one of the ten largest churches in the world.

Pope Francis, Pope Benedict XVI, Saint John Paul II, and Saint Mother Teresa are among the faithful who have visited this magnificent basilica. Now as its one hundredth anniversary approaches, a nationwide effort is underway to complete this great "Hymn in Stone" as its founders envisioned with the mosaic ornamentation of the Trinity Dome.

THE TRINITY DOME

The Trinity Dome is the central and largest dome of the Basilica. This "Crowning Jewel" will be adorned in mosaic and will depict the Most Holy Trinity, the Blessed Virgin Mary as the Immaculate Conception, and a procession of saints who have an association with America and the Basilica. The Nicene Creed will encircle the base of the dome, while the dome's pendentives will feature the four evangelists: Matthew, Mark, Luke and John. The Trinity Dome will complete the work of the Great Upper Church according to its original iconographic scheme and bring to a close construction of the Basilica of the National Shrine of the Immaculate Conception as it approaches its centennial milestone in 2020.

From the Principal

Reflecting, Revitalization, Renewal – Our Journey

Accreditation is the process in which certification of competency, authority, or credibility is presented. St. John Bosco began renewal of its accreditation this year with the actual accreditation to be taking place during the 2018 – 2019 school year.



The bishops of the United States continuously underscore the three-fold mission of Catholic schools – to proclaim the Gospel, to build community, and to serve our brothers and sisters. In their most recent document, *Renewing Our Commitment to Catholic Elementary and Secondary Schools in the Third Millennium*, the United States Catholic Bishops emphasized that the entire Catholic community is called to evangelize our culture, and stressed that Catholic elementary and secondary schools play a critical and irreplaceable role in this endeavor. In this same document, the bishops committed themselves and called on the entire Catholic community to ensure that Catholic schools continue to provide a Gospel-based education of the highest quality. They are recognizing the imperative that Catholic schools must provide an excellent academic program within a faith-filled environment. *National Standards and Benchmarks for Effective Catholic Elementary and Secondary Schools* have been created to provide a national articulation of defining characteristics and performance benchmarks that will enable all sponsors of Catholic elementary and secondary schools to

assess, strengthen and sustain their operations.

The *National Standards and Benchmarks for Effective Catholic Elementary and Secondary Schools* are intended to describe how the most mission-driven, program effective, well managed, and responsibly governed Catholic schools operate. They are offered as school effectiveness standards rather than curriculum content standards, although they support curriculum development consistent with national standards and state standards. They provide benchmarks to determine how well a school is fulfilling its obligation to those who benefit from its services (e.g. students, parents and families, faculty and staff), to donors and contributors, to the Church and to civil society.

The **Defining Characteristics** flow directly from the Holy See's teaching on Catholic schools as compiled by Archbishop J. Michael Miller, statements by the Pope and the American Bishops. The characteristics define the deep Catholic identity of Catholic schools and serve as the platform on which the standards and benchmarks rest.

The **Standards** describe policies, programs, structures, and processes that should be present in mission-driven, program effective, well-managed schools that operate in concert with the defining characteristics. The standards address four domains: Mission and Catholic Identity, Governance and Leadership, Academic Excellence, and Operational Vitality.

The **Benchmarks** provide observable, measurable descriptors for each standard. Benchmarks provide a

solid basis for future development of more detailed self-assessment and diagnostic instruments, data collection and reporting structures, and accreditation tools, as appropriate at the local, diocesan, regional and national levels.

St. John Bosco teachers are concluding at the end of this month adjustments that were made to the first two standards we worked on throughout this past year: Mission and Catholic Identity (An excellent Catholic school is guided and driven by a clearly communicated mission that embraces a Catholic Identity rooted in Gospel values, centered on the Eucharist, and committed to faith formation, academic excellence and service.) and Governance and Leadership (An excellent Catholic school adhering to mission provides a rigorous academic program for religious studies and catechesis in the Catholic faith, set within a total academic curriculum that integrates faith, culture, and life.). Next fall we will begin our reflection on Academic Excellence and Operational Vitality as we continue our journey toward excellence.

St. John Bosco School is shaping future leaders by providing academic excellence in a caring 4K – 8 Catholic environment where God's gifts are nurtured and where faith is put into action.
