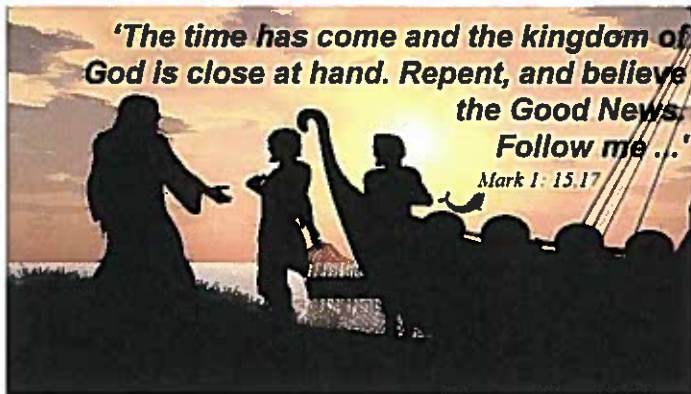

In just a few weeks (January 31st-Feb 8th) 11 adults from our community will be embarking on a life-changing mission trip to Nicaragua!

We work with Catholic Sisters who run an organization called Tepeyac-Nicaragua Foundation. The goal is to bring aid and relief to the poor and distressed people located in the rural areas of Nicaragua. We will be working in a medical clinic, school, and community center. We think we can accomplish a lot if we teach people how to prevent illnesses and be more self-sufficient. We also will be putting on workshops on how to treat water, keep clean, wash hands and brush teeth. A new project this year is helping fund and build a kitchen so the community can sell bread and make money to provide for their families.

Many people have recently been asking how they can support us. Great question!

First and foremost, please pray for us. For our health, safety, and that we can be the light of Christ to those in need.

Secondly, there will be a second collection next weekend (Jan 27th-28th) to help us purchase supplies and medications needed to serve the people once in Nicaragua. Buying and bringing over supplies has proven to be very difficult and expensive. Your donation does NOT pay for our travel expenses—the money will go directly to help the people of Nicaragua.

We are also looking for donations of any non-steel soccer cleats (any size), deflated soccer balls and baseball gloves. These items are expensive in Nicaragua, but bring so much joy to the community!

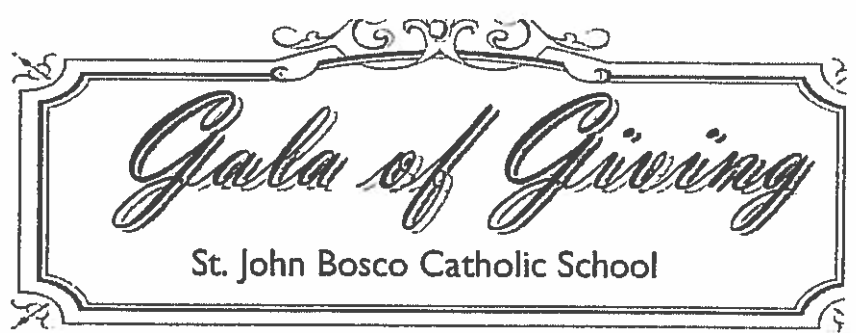
