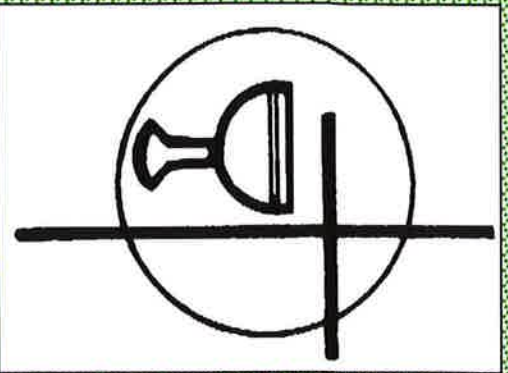

Here is a sneak peek at some of our live auction, silent auction and bag raffle items!

CLASSROOM PROJECTS

- **4K** - Each preschooler painted his/her own canvas and let their minds be creative. These canvases will also be joined together to create a beautiful mural!
- **Kindergarten** - The students created a picture book filled with adorable backyard animals, as well as, a toy chest/ bench painted with sweet little kindergartner hand print animals.

- **6th Grade** - The kids outlined and created colorful birds on a canvas print to depict their journey into middle school. With the simple phrase "To our children we give two things: one is roots, the other is wings."
- **7th Grade** - The girls in this class have joined together to create two mosaic stepping stones.
- **8th Grade** - Photos of the 8th graders from young to old are included with a written paragraph from each student about their most memorable school moment and combined into a scrapbook titled "Look How Far We Have Come".

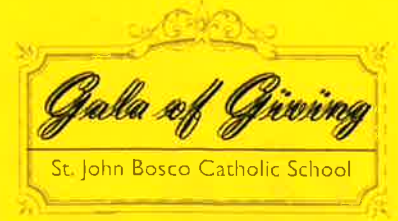

From the Principal



Last week we began our Lenten journey. Lent is a special time of year that allows and encourages us to grow in our faith.

It tells us to put aside the external things in our lives we tend to focus on and look to the internal. It is a time for prayer, sacrifice and charity.

At St. John Bosco one of the ways we are growing our relationship with God during Lent is by joining together on Monday mornings for a brief prayer service. It's amazing how 10 minutes together can make a hectic Monday something special. Hearing the students sing the responsorial psalm clear and strong resonates through the school and lifts me closer to God.

In Mass on Ash Wednesday, Fr. talked about having a wonderful Lent by doing more by giving up. I'll give up being messy and keep my room clean. I'll give up time playing video games, and spend more time helping my Mom with chores. I'll give up watching TV after school and get my homework done right away. I'll give up time on my tablet and play a board or card game with my sibling. Focusing on the good that comes from giving up, lets us work to have a wonderful Lent.

Charity during Lent is shown through participating in the Rice Bowl program. Each student receives a rice bowl and a Lenten calendar with daily reflections. These reflections help our students to know how they are blessed and how to share their blessing by giving alms (25¢ in their rice bowl). After Easter the rice bowls are turned into

school and shared with the Catholic Relief Services to make a difference in world hunger.

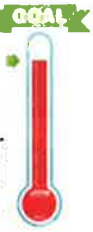
Heart Healthy

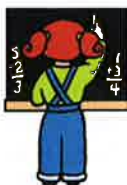
