Please make every effort to attend these highly informational training/information sessions.

Silent Candlelight Walk: Wis. Right to Life

Join us on Sat. Jan. 21st at 6:25pm as we prepare to walk at 6:30pm from the main entrance of the Government Center (421 Nebraska St) to Ministry-D.C. Medical Center. The Courthouse symbolizes that abortion became legal with our Supreme Court's decision in 1973 (44 years ago); the Hospital symbolizes a life saving facility in CONTRAST to the massive killing taking place legally. Those of us who believe in the RIGHT TO LIFE acknowledge our local hospital's policy on not performing abortions on its premises. This is not a protest march but a Silent Candlelight Walk, so no signs, but please bring your own lantern or candle (enclosed in a jar for a windbreak). Everyone is welcome, including children. Please dress warm and listen to the local radio station in case of cancellation for bad weather. If it's cancelled, it will be rescheduled for the next night, which is Sun. Jan. 22nd. Anyone who cannot walk can place a candle in their window the night of the walk and say a prayer.

- Triple antibiotic cream
- Ibuprofen, Acetaminophen, Expectorants
- Children and adult vitamins (Folic Acid, Zinc, Calcium, prenatal vitamins)

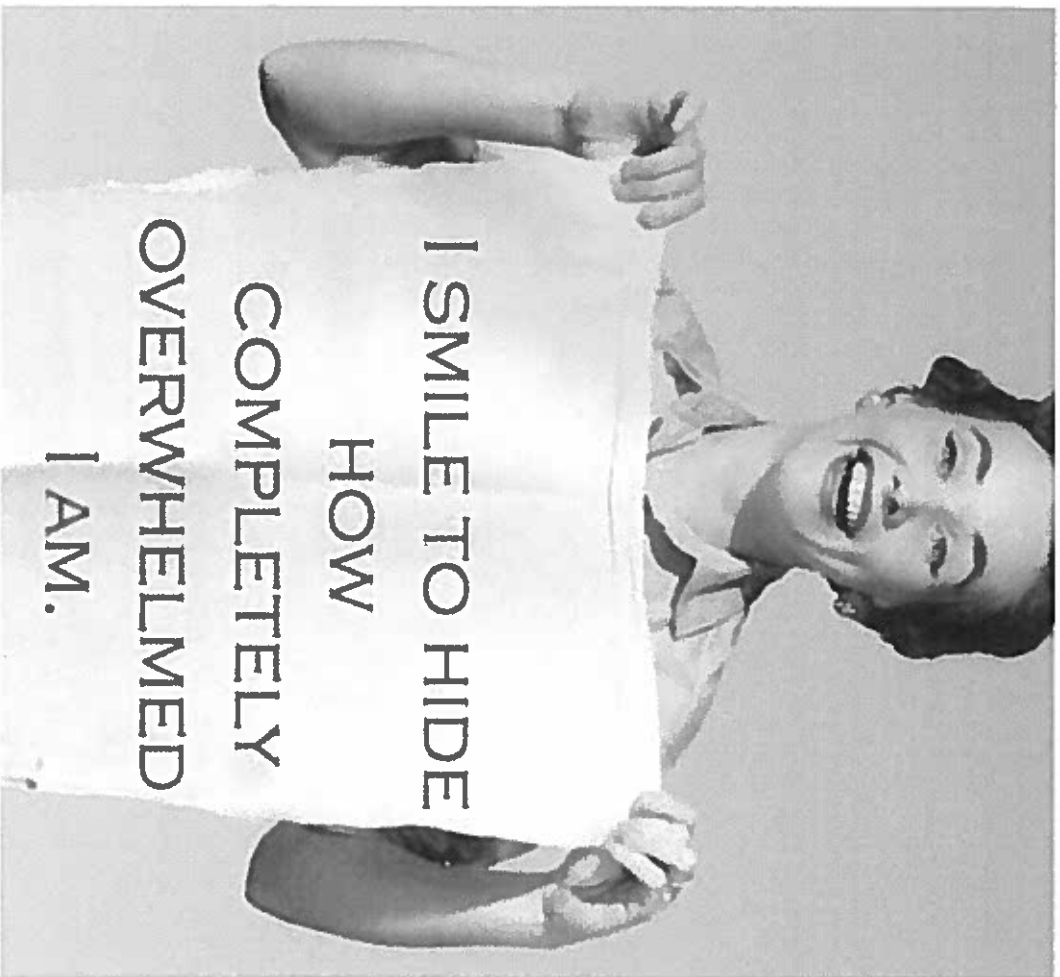
OR money to help us pick up things we can't bring with us: for example, cough syrup.
